What is a Case Study?

A case study is a description of a real or hypothetical problem or challenge that an educator confronts in teaching situations.

Why Use Case Studies?



Motivating and student-focused



Allow learners to apply what they've learned to real world situations.



Help learners develop critical thinking, problem solving, analytical, and decision making skills in complex and ambiguous situations.
